Leora Botnick is a Social Work Supervisor in NYC Health + Hospitals/Jacobi's Ambulatory Care. She is co-chair of the NYC Health + Hospitals Bioethics Council (as only the second non-physician to have this role) and Jacobi's Ethics Committee. She serves as one of the consultants in Jacobi's Clinical Ethics Consultation Service. Prior to coming to Jacobi, she was at NYC Health + Hospitals/ Lincoln where she started in their Cancer Center and ultimately supervised the Oncology and Palliative Care Services. She was part of the first group of social workers to be granted accreditation as an advanced hospice and palliative care social worker from NASW and the Social Work Hospice and Palliative Care Network. She completed the Montefiore Certificate Program in Bioethics and Medical Humanities and subsequently became the co-chair of Lincoln's Ethics Committee. She is a member of the Empire State Bioethics Consortium (ESBC) and recently chaired an ESBC workgroup addressing the involuntary removal of homeless people with mental illness. She participates in regular Clinical Ethics Consultation training run by NYC Health + Hospital's Office of Medical and Professional Affairs. She graduated from Brandeis University and received a BA in Psychology as well as in Near Eastern and Judaic Studies. She received her MSW from the University of Pennsylvania. She also has a private consulting business for advance care planning, medical decision making, etc.

Maria Fernanda Amado Cordova, LMSW is a bilingual clinical social worker supporting inpatients and families at Memorial Sloan Kettering Cancer Center (MSK) in Surgery and End of Life transitions. Before coming to MSK, she worked in psycho-oncology in Mexico and Spain, providing emotional support through diagnosis, treatment, and end-of-life care. She is passionate about reducing disparities and providing equity in services.
